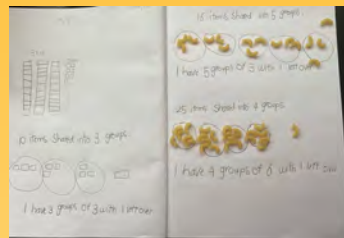
## Stage 1


Continuing with the narrative theme, students were challenged to create their own non-linear narrative story or 'Choose Your Own Adventure'. There were many very creative ideas in evidence!

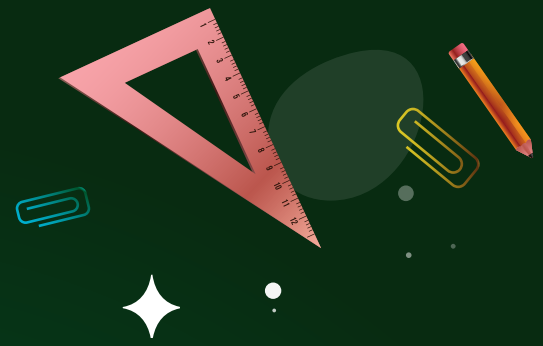

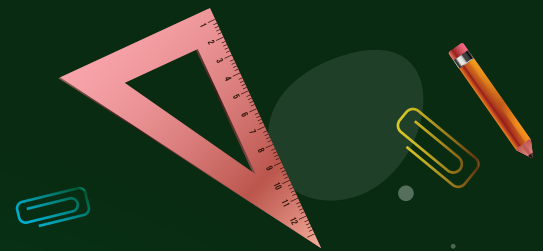
**Is there life on the moon?**

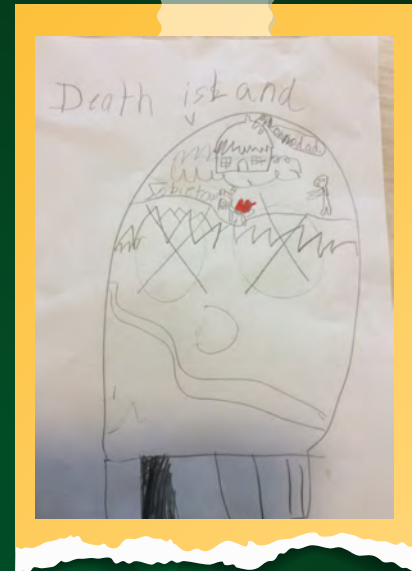

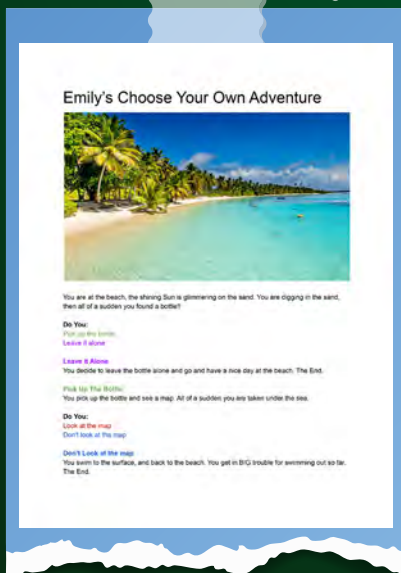




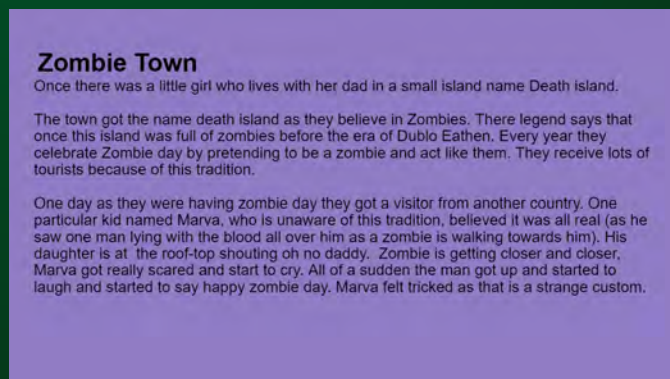

### SPRINGBOK

#### INTRODUCTION TO SPRINGBOKS

Springboks are a species of antelope that is native to Africa. They are the national animal of South Africa and are known for their speed and agility.



**FOOD**

What do Springboks eat? Springboks mostly eat shrubs, grass and other food like these. They also get all of the water that they need from these plants and animals, therefore they are able to live for a very long time without directly drinking water from some type of swimming hole, e.g. lake, river, etc.



**HABITAT**

Springboks generally live in flat, open spaces, like savannahs, shrublands and sometimes even deserts! The Springboks live in Southern Africa, in parts of Botswana and Angola, in Namibia, and in Western parts of South Africa.

**BEHAVIOUR**

One of the Springbok's behavioural patterns is prancing. Prancing is a fascinating behaviour that Springboks display, usually after being awakened when they have gone back. One of the main reasons why prancing is so fascinating is because it is the act where Springboks jump up generally and land so lightly on the ground that it seems like they float in the air for a few seconds before coming slowly back down to earth.

What I feel about the topic:

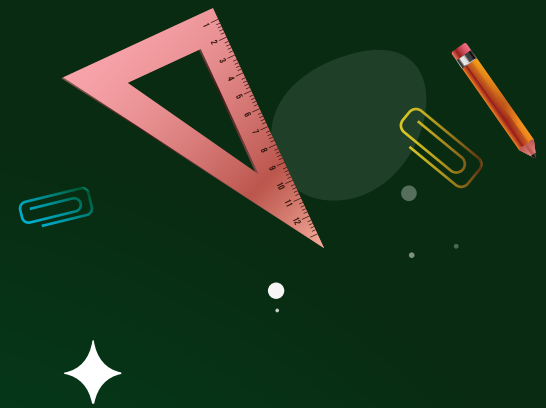
