Last week we launched a trial student mindfulness group during lunch time on Tuesday.

About 14 students attended and participated in a short mindfulness practice from the Smiling Mind website followed by quiet time doing mindfulness colouring. Students demonstrated a good understanding of the value of mindfulness and a commitment to the practice.

We hope to extend the trial into Term 3, if we have ongoing student interest. It is envisaged that the mindfulness room will provide students with a passive play option and a welcomed alternative to the playground. Mindfulness-based social and emotional learning equips children with the skills they need to thrive in life, by building healthy minds that are capable of paying attention to the present moment with openness, curiosity and without judgement.

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Inter-school Debating Round 3-Concord West vs Homebush West

The Concord West Public School debating team came through with an amazing victory on Thursday the 23rd of June. The team was Sophie K as first speaker, Molly M as second, Hanbi P as third and Emily B who made an awesome fourth speaker. The debate was performed in the school hall in front of the other stage three classes, and for this debate the Homebush West students came to our school.

Stage 3: Food and Fibre

This term Stage 3 has been learning about food and fibre in science. They have discovered that mass manufactured food such as fruit and veg, meat and eggs have a big environmental impact. Some of these impacts include soil erosion, water shortages, animal loss and deforestation. These impacts will be felt for generations to come.

One of the solutions to mass manufacturing is growing and buying food locally. Locally produced food has a shorter food chain which means it can be better for you, the community, and the environment. Some of the advantages are that it is fresher, cheaper, and you can know where it comes. It also has less chemicals and a lower carbon footprint, as it needs less transport to get from farm to plate.



To be a part of the solution to environmental issues, Stage 3 are

starting their own small businesses at school. They are growing winter herbs and vegetables in the school garden and hope to sell them to families later in the year.
