ATTENDANCE

Every day counts! Regular attendance at school is essential to assist students to maximise their potential. Students are required to attend school each day it is open, unless they are unwell. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children. As you can see in the attachments provided in this newsletter, every minute counts!

You can help foster positive attendance habits by:

- · helping your child learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- · ensuring your child arrives on time from the start of the school day, ready to participate in learning
- · reducing disruption to learning where possible, by planning any necessary appointments outside of school time
- · promptly communicating any absence to the school (within 7 days of the first day of any absence)
- · working with the school to encourage and support regular attendance.

In partnership with you, schools also have a responsibility in promoting regular attendance. We can support your child's attendance by:

- · monitoring each student's attendance and absences
- · following up on absences and attendance concerns
- · communicating with families after consecutive absences.

Please understand that teachers have a responsibility to connect with their students and their families if they are not attending school.

With international borders now open, it is expected that some families will be travelling to visit relatives and friends. It is strongly recommended that families travel during school holidays, so learning is not disrupted. However, if you plan to travel outside the school holidays, please inform your child's teacher in advance.

An 'Application for Extended Leave' form needs to be completed and approved prior to the trip. This can be downloaded from the school website forms page.

SCHOOL GATES

A reminder that the Concord Rd gate will remain locked during school hours. Below are the times it will be unlocked:

Morning - 8.30am - 9.15am

Afternoon – 2.45pm – 3.10pm

Please ensure you enter and exit via the Queen St gate at other times.

School site security and student safety remains a high priority. This term alone, there has been 25 security incidences notified to the Department, ranging from finding litter e.g. alcohol bottles to unauthorised people and dogs on site. Therefore, to secure the school, it is essential that there is only 1 main entry to the school which is Queen St. The school has a plan in place to facilitate future exiting via Concord Rd but as with all projects, there is an implementation time which we are trying to expediate. SISA Athletics (Term 2) and Gymnastics (Term 3)

This year, we are excited to be able to offer our students at Concord West Public School the opportunity to be involved in the SISA Athletics and Gymnastics programs. Compulsory school attendance

Information for parents

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

What are my Legal responsibilities?

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or, are registered with the NSW Education and Standards Authority for home schooling.

Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

The Importance of arriving on time

Arriving at school and class on time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- · Give students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

What if my child has to be away from school?

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick, or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g. attending a funeral)

Following an absence from school you must ensure that within 7 days you provide your child's school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence. However, if the school has not received an explanation from you within 2 days, the school may contact you to discuss the absence.

Principals may decline to accept an explanation that you have provided if they do not believe the absence is in the best interest of your child. In these circumstances your child's absence would be recorded as unjustified. When this happens the principal will discuss their decision with you and the reasons why.

Principals may request medical certificates or other documentation when frequent or long term absences are explained as being due to illness. Principals may also seek parental permission to speak with medical specialists to obtain information to collaboratively develop a health care plan to support your child. If the request is denied, the principal can record the absences as unjustified.

Travel

Families are encouraged to travel during school holidays. If travel during school term is necessary, discuss this with your child's school principal. An Application for Extended Leave may need to be completed. Absences relating to travel will be marked as leave on the roll and therefore contribute to your child's total absences for the year.

In some circumstances students may be eligible to enrol in distance education for travel periods over 50 school days. This should be discussed with your child's school principal.

My child won't go to school what should I do?

You should contact the principal as soon as possible to discuss the issue and ask for help. Strategies to help improve attendance may include a referral to the school's learning and support team or linking your child with appropriate support networks. The principal may seek further support from the Home School Liaison Program to develop an Attendance Improvement Plan.

What might happen if my child continues to have unacceptable absences?

It is important to understand that the Department of Education may be required to take further action where children of compulsory school age have recurring numbers of unexplained or unjustified absences from school.

Some of the following actions may be undertaken:

Compulsory Schooling Conferences

You may be asked, along with your child, to attend a Compulsory Schooling Conference. The conference will help to identify the supports your child may need to have in place so they attend school regularly. The school, parents and agencies will work together to develop an agreed plan (known as Undertakings) to support your child's attendance at school.

 Application to the Children's Court – Compulsory Schooling Order

If your child's attendance at school remains unsatisfactory the Department may apply to the Children's Court for a Compulsory Schooling Order. The Children's Court magistrate may order a Compulsory Schooling Conference to be convened.

· Prosecution in the Local Court

School and Department staff remain committed to working in partnership with you to address the issues which are preventing your child's full participation at school. In circumstances where a breach of compulsory schooling orders occurs further action may be taken against a parent in the Local Court. The result of court action can be the imposition of a community service order or a fine.

What age can my child leave school?

All New South Wales students must complete Year 10 or its equivalent. After Year 10, and up until they reach 17 years of age, there are a range of flexible options for students to complete their schooling.

Working in Partnership

The NSW Department of Education recognises that working collaboratively with students and their families is the best way to support the regular attendance of students at school.

We look forward to working in partnership with you to support your child to fulfil their life opportunities.




