WHAT WE ARE LEARNING

English:

Sounds (Phonics):

Phonemic awareness and letter/sound knowledge are important skills for reading and writing. Students will learn about how sounds work in the following order.

a,m,s,t i,f,d,r o,g,l,h u,c,b,n

k,v,e,w j,p,y,x q,z

We will also be learning about rhyming words, syllables and learning the difference between a word, letter and a sentence as we participate in listening games.

In **Writing** lessons, the students will be learning correct pencil grip, copying sentences left to right, leaving spaces between words and forming letters correctly.

Reading: Children will be placed into groups according to their phonics knowledge and reading ability. They will begin learning to read simple texts and understand the meaning of simple punctuation.

Homework: Kindergarten children are not expected to complete formal homework. This time should be spent reading and playing games or outdoors. Sight words have been sent home for students to practise. Teachers gave ideas on how to do this at the Parent Information session.

Attendance: There is a lot of learning that takes place each day in the classroom and it is important that your child attend school on time, EVERY day- otherwise they will miss out on important concepts. If your child is absent from school, please provide a written explanation by note or the Skoolbag app. The Home School Liaison officer regularly checks student attendance.

Specialist Lessons

Kindergarten students have music, library, Korean and Italian lessons each week.

Maths:

In number lessons the students will be counting forwards and backwards to at least 12, learning to identify a number before or after a given one and learning to form written numbers correctly.

They will also be learning about length, position, days

Science:

of the week and 2D shapes.

Students are learning about the weather and our environment.

History:

This term the students will be learning about "My Family". They will learn about their own family stories and the heritage of others.

Friendly Schools (Social Skills):

The children will be developing social skills and learning how to manage emotions.

P.E (Sport)

This term the children will begin by learning fundamental movement skills and developing their fitness.
